1. Essential Information

1-1 Background:

Since late twentieth century, we have renewed our recognition of the threat incurred by many emerging and re-emerging infectious diseases that often originate in the tropical and developing countries. The speed at which these infectious diseases spread from one country to another has been accelerating due to ever-expanding economic activities and international travels. Such recognition has brought tropical medicine, the field of medicine with which we address these issues, back into the limelight.

The Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences at Nagasaki University is the only school in Japan that runs a PhD course specializing in emerging infectious diseases and tropical medicine. Furthermore, the Institute of Tropical Medicine, Nagasaki University has been playing a central role in medical research in the tropics, human development and providing human resources for disease control programs overseas.

Since April 2006, the Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences at Nagasaki University has integrated in its postgraduate education the Master of Tropical Medicine course with the aim of (1) equipping medical doctors with practical knowledge and problem-solving skills that are directly relevant to clinical practice in the tropics, and (2) contributing to the global efforts to reduce the burden of tropical and infectious diseases.

1-2 Admission Policy:

This course aims to provide its students with opportunities to learn a broad range of skills and knowledge relevant to practicing medicine, formulating disease control programs and conducting medical research in tropical and developing countries. It also aims to provide students with an ability to solve practical problems they are likely to encounter in the tropics by applying the principles of epidemiology and the methods of state-of-the-art molecular medicine.

This course is particularly suitable for medical doctors with at least 2 years of clinical experience who have strong interests in infectious diseases occurring primarily in the tropics or have future plans of working in tropical countries.

1-3 Contents of the course:

The course consists of three components: a) lectures, tutorials and practicals (laboratory practices); b) overseas clinical training; and c) a research project. Students are required to attend all components and demonstrate fulfillment of learning objectives by passing formal examinations and, for the research project, by submitting a Master thesis in order to obtain the Master degree in Tropical Medicine from Nagasaki University.

a. Lectures and Practicals (from April to July)

Lectures and practicals aim to teach essential and advanced knowledge of clinical infectious diseases with reference to microbiology, virology, parasitology and entomology. It will also build up diagnostic laboratory skills and epidemiological skills including study design, data management and medical statistics. The course will hold a series of case discussions on clinical cases and disease outbreaks with particular focus on diagnosis, treatment, prevention and control.

b. Overseas Training (August)

All students will travel to Thailand and stay for two weeks where they will visit local hospitals, other health facilities, internationally recognized research groups, and non-governmental organizations. The activities will be hosted and supervised by a Division in the Ministry of Public Health of Thailand. In the hospitals, students will attend ward rounds and have case discussions. Elsewhere, the topics covered include the role of reference laboratories and disease surveillance, outbreak investigations, international research and policy collaboration, and community health.

c. Research Project (from September to March)

All students will be assigned to conduct a research project under the supervision of professors and will submit a Master thesis. As an alternative to Master thesis, Japanese students may take an up-to-five-months overseas clinical training in which the writing of a report on cases is required. The training will be done at our affiliated infectious disease hospitals, Bach Mai Hospital in Hanoi, Vietnam or San Lazaro Hospital in Manila, the Philippines.

2. APPLICATION PROCEDURES

The Application Forms (other forms than application fee form) can be downloaded from the internet website (http://www.tm.nagasaki-u.ac.jp/mtm/index.html). These Forms are in Microsoft Word format. If you have any problems obtaining the forms, you should contact us. You must apply either as a Japanese applicant or a non-Japanese applicant based on your nationality. If you have Japanese nationality but live outside Japan, you should still apply as a Japanese applicant.

Registration:

Twelve students will be registered for admission into the course. There are two periods of recruitment: 8 places are available for Autumn 2009 recruitment for non-Japanese applicants and 4 places for Spring 2010 recruitment for Japanese applicants.

Entrance Requirements:

<u>Applicants must have a degree in medicine</u>. In addition, he or she must have at least two years of clinical experience or recent professional experience in a relevant discipline.

Note: If you do not have two years of clinical experience but have recent professional experience in a relevant discipline, please check your eligibility for application by contacting the course coordinator at hit-sato@nagasaki-u.ac.jp prior to sending a full

package of application documents. You may contact us in Japanese if preferred.

3. SELECTION PROCESS

All eligible applications will be processed. The submitted documents will be checked for authenticity and assessed using standardized selection criteria. All applicants will take an examination where questions relevant to the field of tropical medicine/infectious diseases will be asked and English communication skills will be sought.

Examination methods

- Non-Japanese applicants living overseas will be assessed by an interview over the telephone (see 3-A below); the applicants will be provided with details on how the telephone interview will be conducted when they first contact the course staff for eligibility check.
- All Japanese applicants and Non-Japanese applicants living in Japan will be invited to take a written examination and an interview (see 3-B below).
