

SITUATION AND GENERAL INFORMATION ON CAMEROON-1

- **Cameroon** :Central African country.
- **Population**:26.6 million (2020)
- Women :51 % of the total population
- Total fertility rate :4.6, children per woman







SITUATION AND General information on Cameroon-2



Literacy Rate: 77.07% (2018),

- The MCH Hand book is issued at booking and it is filled by health providers in HFs in Cameroon
- Digital health recording in Cameroon in most HFs is limited to DHIS for the reporting of health statistics.
- Smart phone and internet penetration rate in Cameroon is at 40% and 34% respectively (2020).
- The major Mobile networks are MTN and ORANGE

HFs: Health Facilities **DHIS:** District Health Information System

 MCH handbook was introduced in Cameroon in May 2010

• **Goal**: Contribute to reduce maternal and child mortality

• Main objective: Progressively scale up its use to nationwide.

JICA training in Japan: Participants from 7 countries (Oct. 2008)



Cameroonian participant

- M/E and progressive scaling-up of its use
- Introduced in 42 out of 189 HDs in Cameroon (22.2%).
- Presentation of results of M/E at short term.

HF: Health Facilities




Editions of the MCH Handbook

2nd Edition: 2013, separate French and English copies





3rd Edition: 2016, Bilingual Edition both French and English in one booklet.






Specificities of the bilingual MCH Handbook, 3rd edition:

- Both the French and English languages are merged in all the pages (red headings and bullets for French and bleu for English)
- 68 illustrations (24 in the maternal and 44 in the child section).
- Contains a certificate of immunization to be signed by a health provider on completion of routine immunization
- Useful telephone contacts on the back cover page.

Specificities of the bilingual MCH Handbook






Reasons for developing a bilingual MCH handbook in Cameroon

- Cameroon is a bilingual country
- Official documents/tools translated to both languages in Cameroon
- In 2017, the MCH Handbook was adopted as the **unique** tool for follow up of the mother and her child up to 5 years of age.
- It is economically cost effective
- To facilitate communication between health providers service users irrespective of the language.

EVOLUTION OF PROGRESS INDICATORS




IMPACT OF USE OF THE MCH HANDBOOK ON MAJOR MCH INDICATORS IN CAMEROON -1



IMPACT OF USE OF THE MCH HANDBOOK ON MAJOR MCH INDICATORS IN CAMEROON -2


Improved Nutritional status of children within the years correlate with the number of MCH Hand books used by Health facilities.



IMPACT OF USE OF THE MCH HANDBOOK ON MAJOR MCH INDICATORS IN CAMEROON -3

Maternal health indicators

- Health facility births:
 61% (2011) to 67% (2018)
- Increase in antenatal care uptake rate
- Maternal mortality dropped from 782 in 2011 to 467 per 100,000 life births in 2018.




IMPACT OF USE OF THE MCH HANDBOOK ON MAJOR

MCH INDICATORS IN CAMEROON -4

 Increase in uptake for intermittent preventive malaria treatment

 Improved indicators correlate with increase use on MCH handbook from 2011 to 2022



STRENGTHS AND CHALLENGES



STRENGTHS:

- Cameroon's bilingual MCH Handbook serves as a template for French and English speaking African countries.
- The MCH Handbook is very much appreciated by the service providers and service users where it is in used;
- The MCH handbook project can readily incorporate the innovative, MCH App.
- Digitalization of the MCH handbook would be an added value to the MCH service in Cameroon.

CHALLENGE:

MCH handbook use is not yet nationwide (22,2%)

Prospects that the MCH handbook will be connected to the Health information system of mothers and children-1

Considering the situation in Cameroon,

- A software Application (MCH App.) can be developed to relay health information in the MCH handbook to mothers by use of mobile phones.
- Appropriate alert messages and notifications can be transmitted to pregnant women and mothers of children <5 years on MCH issues.
- Service users can receive notifications on up-coming vaccinations and appointments by automated messages.



PROSPECTS THAT THE MCH HANDBOOK WILL BE CONNECTED TO THE HEALTH INFORMATION SYSTEM OF MOTHERS AND CHILDREN-2

- Digitalization of the MCH handbook would benefit all mothers and children, including those who cannot use the MCH app through policies made using data from the MCH registry
- It would serve as a motivating factor for HFs to acquire the MCH handbook to satisfy client demand, with eventual scaling-up of nationwide use.
- Success use of the MCH Handbook as a tool for "continuum of care" is evidence for the feasibility of piloting the digitalized MCH handbook and MCH registration in Cameroon.

CONCLUSION



- The MCH handbook turns to be a tool to improve Maternal and child health in Cameroon
- Digitalization of the MCH handbook by the introduction of an MCH application is a feasible innovation that can be piloted in Cameroon with possible partner support
- These tools would enable better decision-making, better quality of antenatal and perinatal care and a reduction of maternal and infant mortality in Cameroon and contribute to public health in Africa.






